Profile: Charles Thurmond '30

Thurmond Still Young and Loyal at Age 91

Charles Thurmond has been a Kappa Alpha longer than most, and will always be loyal to his fraternity. He continues to meet younger KAs and enjoy their company. He says, "They think I'm old, but I'm not." In this brief Q&A interview, he shares memories of a different kind of KA.

Q: Why did you join the fraternity?

A: Kappa Alpha is the greatest fraternity in the world. I had a special friend, Jesse Jewel, who influenced me. I had pledged a different fraternity while in high school. Jesse saw the pin and pulled it off and put on a KA pin. That was the best thing that could happen to me.

Q: Tell us about your favorite memory of the fraternity. A: Some say we were the knights of alcohol, but that wasn't right. The fraternity is one of my greatest memories. It was a great experience. I'm only 91 now. Things were different in the old days. We would carry KA pins with us, and we were allowed to put the pins on others and pledge them on the spot.

Q: What kind of influence has the fraternity had on your life since graduation?

A: I believe in Kappa Alpha. It still influences me. I still work with the younger Kappa Alphas around Gainesville (Georgia).

Q: With whom do you still stay in contact?

A: There's a few in Gainesville. I'm the oldest one though and don't stay in too much contact with others.

Q: Tell us about your family: Have you married? Do you have children?

A: I picked out my wife when she was 12 and I was 15. We've been together for many years. We have three daughters.

Q: What other activities or organizations were you involved with during your college days?

A: I only got to stay at the University of Georgia for one and a half years because I couldn't get a football scholarship. I had to leave to go to work.

Q: What is your nickname, and how did you get it? A: Oh yeah, I had a nickname, but I can't tell you because my wife gets mad. Okay, it was Booger - a horrible name. Whenever someone said it, my wife would say, "His name is Charles, not Booger."

Q: Did you live in the house? If so, who were your room-

A: No, I lived in Miss May's Boarding House right down the road from the KA house. I paid \$25 a month for room and board.

Q: What do you do for a living?

A: After leaving school, I worked for an insurance company. Then I went to law school in Atlanta and practiced law until 1970. I worked with Jesse Jewel, a Kappa Alpha and a friend. He was the "father of the Georgia poultry business." I was his full-time lawyer.

Since then, I've been in the motel/real estate business. My wife wants me out of the house at least part of the day, so I am not
