A New Door Opens at Gamma Chapter

As many of you have read in previous issues of Between the Columns, the Gamma trustees have been actively exploring and trying to determine what our options are for the house over the past two years. Many of you have either heard or seen in the news that the university has asked five fraternities on Lumpkin Street to relocate by June 2007. It was their determination that other university programs were more in line with the strategic plan for that property. We, of course, are one of the houses that must relocate.

It is fortune that we started looking for alternatives over two years ago. Recently, 10 alumni formed Gamma Partners, LLC. On November 1, this group purchased property at 755 W. Hancock. The property is located two blocks northeast of The Varsity and the Alpha Delta Pi house, six blocks from downtown and a block off Milledge Avenue. Totaling 2.55 acres, it is currently the home to Cobb Hill Apartments.

While the property that we have purchased is not as close to campus as the current house, times have changed. We have found ourselves

in a position where we must move forward. The board chose this property based on its location, the character of the neighborhood and zoning that allowed for Greek living. In other words, a fraternity will fit in nicely.

Our decisions are even more fortunate than we first realized. On Tuesday, Feb. 7, Athens-Clarke County issued a moratorium on fraternities locating anywhere in Clarke

County. It also is forbidding fraternities from seeking building permits. We were given prior notice that this would be added at the last minute to the agenda. Thus, we were able to get architects and engineers to submit an application to be grandfathered in prior to moratorium. It was a success.

The hard work and foresight of our board has put KA in a position to control our destiny and thrive for another 136 years. I look forward to sharing additional information about our groundbreaking, new house, Fall 2007 ribbon-cutting ceremony and more in future communications. would like to thank alumni for contributions, which will keep our traditions alive and ensure us a permanent home.


In addition to many generous alumni donations, the brothers of the Gamma Chapter have pledged to contribute as well. Thus far, nearly 80% of active members have
