Protecting Our Future at UGA: Update on 755 W. Hancock

The Gamma Advisors have performed a tremendous amount of work and due diligence regarding housing opportunities for Kappa Alpha. Our efforts are to ensure a quality home for our undergraduate members and a house that alumni can be proud of when they return to Athens. After enjoying 54 years of residence on Lumpkin St., UGA determined it needed that land for additional classroom space,

therefore asking the fraternity to find another home by December of 2007 and offering us a lot on River Road with a 15-year lease. The Board, based on feedback from the stakeholders, elected to pass on this offer. We feel it is in Gamma's best interest to own our own property.

With the help of realtor, Gerry Whitworth and Athens-Clarke County, the Board determined that to accommodate a Chapter

our size (120 men) the fraternity needed to find at least 1.5 acres of land that was zoned for multifamily living. An apartment complex was a perfect fit for our needs.

With that in mind, Gamma Partners, LLC was established as a limited liability company by thirteen KA alumni. Gamma Partners, LLC

purchased Cobb Hill Apartments (54 units) and two student houses for a total of 3 acres at a cost of \$3 Million. The members of Gamma Partners, LLC personally guaranteed the loan for Cobb Hill and agreed to do this for KA with absolutely no financial profit for themselves.

The Board chose the Hancock Corridor area for multiple reasons. The neighborhood had the proper zoning, is not part of any Clarke County Historic District and already has other apartments, motels and a significant student population. Lastly, given its close proximity to downtown, the location is a major draw for student members.

Immediately following the property purchase, Gamma Advisors approached county commissioners, the mayor and the neighbors on the immediate block regarding our intentions. Pat Allen, a representative of The University of Georgia's Government Affairs office, joined us for lunch with Commissioner

George Maxwell and assisted us in coordinating a town hall meeting at Hill Baptist Church. Gamma Advisors undertook these measures in good faith. We want to be good neighbors!

Many of you have seen media coverage regarding our purchase. The concerns primarily involve the fraternity leaving the on-campus site and "invading" a quiet neighborhood. While we appreciate the concerns of nonresidents, we feel the neighborhood has been incorrectly characterized in the media. We believe it is the optimal location for KA, providing ample parking and a great university town environment for Gamma. The Hancock Corridor is predominantly comprised of business, county and state owned or rental properties. The Hancock Corridor is in the midst of a major revitalization. Piedmont College purchased an additional 3 acres less than two-tenths of a mile from our site. Additionally, within walking distance we find these neighbors, the SAE house, Alpha Delta Pi Sorority, the Athens-Clarke County Health Department, The Varsity, TRR Cobb House (a confederate museum), UGA's Carl Vinson Center and an Egyptian Temple.

After we purchased the 755 Hancock site, had architectural plans in place and filed for our building permit the University extended Gamma another offer, along with five other Lumpkin Street fraternities, to move to River Road. To make the best decision for the Chapter, even though we were well invested in the Hancock project, the Board diligently reviewed the proposal.

The University's proposal included offering

us land and the coordination of construction of a new house. They also offered to arrange the financing of the project. In the final analysis, Gamma was going to pay more to lease from the University than to own our own property. The direct ownership of 755 Hancock allows us to control the destiny of Gamma for the next 100 years. No member of the Board wants future Gamma generations to be faced with the same decisions. For these reasons, the Board rejected the University's proposal by a vote of 39-1.

Engineering and architectural plans have been submitted to Athens-Clarke County for final approval. We expect to have a final meeting with the county by October 10th to review the plans, with the hope of beginning construction before the end of the year. We are very excited about the design and feel of the new house. It will be a great environment for the Chapter and will include air conditioning, high-speed internet access, and a 1,200 sq. ft. Chapter/TV room with stadium seating. The new house will also have both a 2,460 sq. ft. social hall and a 936 sq. ft. dining room instead of the 425 sq. ft. space currently shared for meals and socials. Separate quarters for a house mother or resident graduate assistant will also be included in the building design. The new house will have roughly 1250 sq. ft. of living space which is comparable to what we enjoyed at Lumpkin Street.

Gamma is poised to move forward with our new home. With that said, we need significant contributions from our alumni base to fund the project and support the Chapter's continued

growth and prosperity. To be able to break ground, we need to raise \$3 Million. Currently, we have a little over \$2 Million pledged by 83 alumni. The Campaign Committee has been approaching Brothers who have expressed a willingness to consider a significant pledge of \$25,000 or more and will continue to approach others. The official public announcement and mass solicitation phase of the campaign will be launched soon giving every one of our Gamma Brothers the chance to support our future.
