Miracle on the Hudson

Gamma Alumnus Survives Infamous Plane Crash

Everyone wants a second chance, a moment in life that will make you realize life can be short and you can't take anything for granted. Brother **Paul Jorgensen '92** believes he got a second chance at life after a plane crash earlier this year. He says he is taking advantage of every second of that chance.

Paul made news as passenger 1A on US Airways flight 1549, which crashed into the Hudson River shortly after takeoff from LaGuardia Airport in NYC on January 15, 2009. After the accident, some of the first people to call Paul were his KA fraternity brothers.

Paul has kept in touch with a lot of his brothers since his college days back in the early '90s and continues to remain an active member of KA.

"Being a brother of KA taught me some valuable ideas and lessons to live by that I still incorporate into my life today," says Paul.

While a brother at UGA, Paul remembers the good times that shaped his college experience and molded the friendships he would keep for a lifetime. Some of his favorites include Cowboy Day and the Old South weekend trip. Practical jokes were a favorite of Paul's, he was never scared to play tricks on his fraternity brothers.

He recalls an instance where he

successfully nailed a brother into his room, forcing him to climb out the front window.

"That was probably my favorite," says Paul.

Life has changed a bit for Paul since days at the KA house. Since then, he has gotten married to wife Meredith and has two young daughters Blake (5) and Ryan (3). In his spare time, Paul's life centers around family and Georgia Football.

"I don't miss a game," says Paul.

He works as the VP of Medical Software Business at Epocrates, Inc. and travels all over the country. This crazy travel schedule is what brought him to LaGuardia Airport this past year.

Paul was traveling from a meeting in NYC back home to Charlotte, NC on Flight 1549.

"I was excited because I got bumped to first class so I had tons of room to get work done during the flight," says Paul.

After taking off and beginning the flight passengers noticed the plane was going down a bit and going back towards the airport. When an unexpected smell of smoke and loud noise from the engine, the passengers started to get nervous. When the flight attendants started to chant, "brace for impact" over and over, Paul knew something was wrong.

"That moment I thought I was going to die. There was nothing I could do, I wasn't panicked, I just thought 'I am going to die.' And then I waited," says Paul as he describes his experience.

After landing on the water and finally

getting into the ferry, Paul knew he was safe from harm and called his family to tell them he was alright. Paul knew he had to get on another plane that night, even though he had some hesitations. "Alcohol helped a little bit," he said.

After the accident, Paul was very hesitant to participate in interviews about his experience.

"All I did was get on a plane. It's nothing special, what the crew did, that was special."

Paul loves to catch up with some of his KA brothers, and remains active in the chapter. He has great memories and cherishes the people he has come to know and the friends he has made.

"I've had lasting friendships that will continue for the rest of my life. KA was clearly the best group of guys to become a part of and I have great memories from my time with all of them."
