FUNDRAISING UPDATE

The Annual Fund is Back!

The annual fund is back! It's been on hiatus as we've focused on the capital campaign since the fall of 2006. Although the campaign is not over, it is coming to an end and therefore, it's time we reinstate the annual fund. For those of you who may have forgotten what the annual fund is or for those of you who have graduated since 2006 and have never been asked to make a contribution to it, here is some information to help refresh your memory.

The annual fund is a YEARLY fundraising effort that drives our annual operating budget.

It supports our communications program (including *Between the Columns* and www.kauga.com), as well as alumni events and programs for the undergraduate chapter.

In our best year (since we started tracking it) we raised more than \$20,000 from 209 donors in the annual fund. We have more than 2,300 alumni, so imagine what we could do if we *all* did our part.

Preserving our Legacy, Strengthening our Foundation

As you know, the *Preserving our Legacy, Strengthening our Foundation* capital campaign is a one-time major fundraising effort to build the chapter house (a project we completed and hope you've had a chance to see in person) and retire our debt. Pledges to the campaign can be paid over a period of up to three years at this stage in the process.

While we are nearing the end of this effort, we still need to raise \$1,000,000. You are probably thinking, how can we be close to the end if we still need \$1,000,000? The answer is simple: thanks to more than 575 alumni, we have already raised more than \$3,361,000. This is AMAZING, but with just under 25% of alumni participation, we know we can do better Our undergraduates deserve

our firm financial footing and help in caring for the house in a manner that all alumni can be proud of. With all this in mind, we know \$1,000,000 is a TREMENDOUS amount of money, particularly in this economy, but it is achievable and here's how.

If half the alumni that have not yet made a contribution the campaign would contribute \$1,500 – just \$500 a year over 3 years – we would surpass our goal and leave the undergraduate chapter in a strong financial position. That means we need 800 alumni to jump in and join the 575+ that have already given. It's easy to read this and think that someone else will be one of that 800, and you can be one of the ones that doesn't get involved, but the truth is, we need alumni

to be active, help carry the load, and do whatever they are able – please don't assume that another will do your part. If you can't do \$1,500 – do whatever you can – every contribution gets us closer to the goal.

KA is for life, and we have all benefited throughout our lives from being KAs. We want to set the fraternity up for the next 100 years. Please join us in securing the future of KA at UGA.

ALUMNI PROFILE

KA Brother Rides Across the U.S. to Support the Make-A-Wish Foundation

Altruism is an important part of the core beliefs of the Gamma Chapter of Kappa Alpha Order. But few alumni take the effort to raise money for charity and generate awareness as far and as personally as did Joe Lariscy '07.

Joe and two other young men, Leigh Buckems and Greg Stahl, organized and set out on a 2,750 mile cross-country charity bike ride from San Francisco, California to St. Simons Island, Georgia. The ride took several weeks and raised over \$30,000 for the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

"(Fellow charity rider) Greg Stahl and I were working together at J.P. Morgan. We were both a year and a half into the investment banking program there," Joe said. "We got to talking, and partly because of the tough economic environment, we decided now would be the ideal time to take a unique path for the near term. We got excited about the idea of working with a not-for-profit, like the Make-A-Wish Foundation. These discussions spawned our decision to do this bike trip."

"I think it [KA] was a great group of guys. I made many friends for life."

"We approached Make-A-Wish about the idea, and had to work with them to explain our idea and what we hoped to achieve in terms of fundraising and awareness," he added. "Once they understood what we were doing, they were on board 100%."

Though Joe started the bike trip independently, KA played an important role in helping to drum up support and fund raising for the event.

"We basically did a publicity tour during the ride, stopping at key cities and appearing at events to promote the charity bike ride. We stopped in Athens, GA and KA helped generate a lot of individual support, arranging a bar for us to appear in and having everyone buy bracelets with all proceeds going to support the Make-A-Wish Foundation. A lot of KAs got behind us in that local event."

Joe participated in charity events while an active KA brother, though nothing on the scale of the charity bike ride. At UGA he participated in the Relay for Life while on campus, as his mother and aunt both had experienced breast cancer. He went to New Orleans to clean houses devastated by Katrina through the Leonard Leadership Scholars Program sponsored by the business school at the University of Georgia. He also participated in a dodgeball tournament to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association.

"Everyone in KA had hours of charity work that we were required to do, but it was pretty much up to the individual how you wanted to spend your hours," Joe said.

He also participated in fund raisers that directly benefitted KA.

"I joined freshman year fall of 2004," he said. "At the time, the fraternity house was a big issue because our lease ended on our old house. I helped with the fundraiser that helped KA build the new fraternity house. It was a huge undertaking and included working closely with the national chapter."

Joe actively served the chapter while in school as Scholarship Chairman his second year and KA Number Three in his Junior and Senior year.

When asked about his impressions of KA overall, this recent graduate responded enthusiastically.

"I think it was a great group of guys," he said. "I made many friends for life. Absolutely there were stand up guys in our chapter and we worked hard and played

hard together. We were there for academics, but you want to get more out of college than the classroom, and KA helped to provide that enriched experience for me and the guys I graduated with."

Out of his own positive experiences with KA and with charity work after college, Joe has some advice for current KA brothers.

"Rather than trying to do everything and getting too thin, I think it's best to get fully involved with those couple of things about which you feel passionate."

Joe stays well connected to the chapter and the other alumni and active brothers that he knows. He tried to make it back for football tailgate parties as a chance to reconnect with people from the town and the chapter.

"I really enjoy the fellowship," Joe said. "When I go back, I know those guys will be there. The brothers are doing a great job with alumni relations. It's a great environment for us, so I'm a big believer in supporting the chapter so that same environment will be there for future generations. The friendships I have from KA and from University of Georgia are important to me and something I wish to maintain for the rest of my life."
