

Following 15 months of construction, I am happy to report that Gamma Chapter's new home is now complete! The Chapter officially moved in on August 1, and we are now able to call 755 West Hancock Avenue "home." The new house is one of the largest on UGA's campus, with nearly 20,000 square feet of commercial construction including materials used such as concrete, brick, steel, and industrial grade sheet rock. Thirty-five Brothers reside in the house, including William Hodges (Number I), Rob Forrester (Number II), and Shepard Smith (Resident Advisor), bringing us to full occupancy.

Gamma Trustees, Inc., the housing corporation, hired a full-service property management firm, Parker and Associates (a local Athens company who has been in the property management business for more than 30 years), to manage the house and handle everything from securing lease agreements, to collecting rent and handling

maintenance calls, to conducting property inspections two times per month. This will fulfill the housing corporation's promise to protect our investment and protect what our donors have made possible, as the firm will provide a measure of accountability for Brothers living in the house.


Moving forward, the final step in completing the approved property development plan is installation of landscaping, mainly trees and shrubbery, which we have delayed due to drought concerns and watering restrictions in north Georgia. We hope to complete this final phase in the next 60 to 90 days. As we prepare to begin this installation, we want to give each Gamma alumnus and parent the opportunity to donate a tree to the property in memory of, or in honor of, a Brother or son. Our landscaping plan is extensive, and there are plenty of great trees that will be added to the property and existing old growth trees for which we

can reserve naming rights. Every tree that is donated will be marked with a placard recognizing the donor and the person that the tree was donated in honor of or in memory of.

We would like nothing better than to have each tree given in recognition of someone who was a part of Gamma Chapter. If you would like to donate a tree, please contact me at 404-379-0061 or jdjonesjr@gmail.com.
